# University overview

O Characteristics and history Chiba University was founded in 1949. Today Chiba University has developed into a large "comprehensive public university", with 10 undergraduate schools, 17 graduate schools, and a number of education and research centers. Our aim is to foster professionals who "always aim higher" and who will tackle anything they do with integrity and a broad perspective.

The Faculty of Education dates to 1872, the year of the establishment of the modern educational system in Japan. For approximately 150 years, the Faculty has significantly contributed to train teachers who undertake leading positions in a wide range of educational institutions. As of FY2023, Bachelor's degree has 1,639 students in 7 courses: Elementary School Teaching, Junior High School Teaching, Elementary and Junior High School Education, English Education, Special Needs Child Education, Infant and Kindergarten Education, School Nursing (Yogo). The Graduate School of Education has 186 students in 2 master programs: Division of School Education and Division of Advanced Professional Development in Education Professional (Degree Course). In addition, the Faculty has the Center for Research, Training and Guidance in Educational Practice Center for Practical Education and 4 attached schools: Kindergarten, Elementary School, Junior High School and the School of Special Needs Education.

You can access to the Narita International Airport in 40 minutes and central Tokyo in 45 minutes by commuter train. It is a very favorable environment for study and research.

# ♦ Course Outline for Teacher Training students

O Advantage of our program

International student should take some classes to learn Japanese language and culture, mainly offered by the Center for International Education (CIE), Chiba University. In addition, student can take classes offered by the Faculty of Education according to their interests and needs. We provide a wide variety of classes and training sessions covering both theory and practice on school education. We also provide many chances to conduct a joint study of International and Japanese students, exchange of views and opinions with in-service school teachers. These great opportunities are quite effective to deepen understanding of the educational systems in Japan and other countries, enable making broader educational and research exchanges. Certificate of Completion will be issued at the end of the course.

- Submit a final report as a summary of the training and give an oral presentation in Japanese or English.

- <u>Japanese language education</u> (preparatory studies)
   Period: 6 months

Contents: Japanese language courses and Japanese Studies Details: Japanese language courses are offered by CIE. Student should take some lessons according to each Japanese ability. Students should take at least 7 classes and 10 hours of lessons per week.

CIE also offers a number of lectures and seminars on Japanese culture and society in English or English-Japanese combined.

- <u>Specialized education</u> in the Faculty of Education Period: 11 months
  - Classes will be held in Japanese language. Students should take some lectures, seminars and discussions in the specialized field under the academic mentor.
  - Some classes may include participatory subjects such as field trips and regional exchanges with Japanese students/residents.

Student can also study educational issues in various countries and gain educational knowledge or skills for international mutual understanding.
